Part 1: FOCUS ON BREADTH VIA SKETCH PROMPTS

I have a list of 40 sketch prompts. You must choose 20 and complete 20 sketches, spending a minimum of 1 hour per idea. Each piece should display forethought, good composition, exceptional craftsmanship, have mature subject matter (avoid trite, overused symbols). These should be finished drawings, or very close to it. Sometimes breadth pieces come from sketchbooks. Choose from this list or create your own ideas for your 20 pieces (and yes, you can do ALL 40 or you can even do more!) VERY IMPORTANT, please only work in the following sizes 8x10, 9x12, 11x14, 12x18 or 18x24...this will help with framing later if the work is chosen as a QUALITY piece.

Please note: If you are unable to go to an art museum, look up artists, past and present. Choose 3, **create 3 mini-informational posters...** you are the teacher, you decide what importation info should on the poster... make sure it includes sketches and/or pictures of the artists' works.
